California's AB 1058 Program

One of the nation's largest child support programs

- 102 Child Support Commissioners
- 157 Family Law Facilitators
- 811 Support Staff
- 53,729 collective total hours of IV-D hearings



Program Accomplishments

Established new child support orders for nearly 1 million families

\$2.5 billion child support collected and distributed to families

42,014 court users assisted with IV-D by family law facilitators



Improving Service Delivery

- Almost all courts have a combination of in-person (66%) and remote (34%) services.
- Remote services: telephone, email, videoconference, live chat, co-browsing, text, mail, and e-filing.
- Remote hearings will continue until January 1, 2027 statutes extended by the Legislature.



Family Law Facilitator New Practices

Implemented over the last 12-months to improve service delivery, efficiency, and court user experience.

- Better use of technology
- Extending services hours
- Increasing number of workshops
- Providing courtroom support

Everyone's Favorite Topic: The Budget

- Local assistance/LCSA Funding
 - Overall funding reduction for State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2024-25 is approximately \$6M
 General Fund, \$18M total funds.
 - LCSAs had been receiving increasing funding over several years with goal of approaching full funding based on approved allocation methodology.
 - Compromise reduction based on unspent funds at the end of SFY 2023-24.
 - Expected to be two-year reduction rather than permanent.
 - Expected impacts
- State Operations Funding
 - Statewide directives regarding vacant positions and target of 8% reduction.



Big Changes: SB 343

- Implementation of SB 343, Flexibility, Efficiency and Modernization Final Rule:
 Two Last Phases
 - Guideline formula changes effective September 1, 2024
 - DCSS Guideline Calculator changes implemented July 21, 2024
 - ✓ For tax year 2024, users have the option to select new or old guideline formula
 - By selecting *new* guideline formula, default for add-on child support is shifted to allocation based on income
 - Extensive training for LCSAs and private bar on usage of DCSS Guideline Calculator
 - User Guide updated
 - LCSA/Court collaboration regarding pleading expectations is key
 - IV-D specific pleading changes coming January 1, 2026
 - ✓ NO MORE presumed income pleadings
 - Outstanding pleadings can proceed through pre-2026 process
 - ✓ Where actual income is unknown or earning capacity exceeds actual income, LCSAs will start pleading earning capacity at the establishment phase
 - LCSA/Court collaboration regarding pleading expectations is key
 - ✓ Judgments established based on earning capacity must proceed by hearing; no default
 - If no appearance by Parent Ordered to Pay Support, there are annual review requirements



The Ultimate Goal: Helping Families

- Former Assistance Assigned Arrears Pass Through
 - Enacted through budget process in 2022
 - Implemented in CSE effective for collections on and after May 1, 2024
 - Successful effort has distributed over \$42M* to cases!
 - Report to Legislature regarding potential unintended impacts, in collaboration with California Department of Social Services (CDSS), is still pending their final review
- Current Assistance Full Pass Through
 - Budget Act directed CDSS and DCSS to host workgroup meetings and deliver Report to Legislature regarding potential full pass through of child support to currently assisted families
 - Will explore suggested mitigation for impacts, such as increasing disregard
 - Will provide estimate of cost, as DCSS must pay the Federal share of collections disbursed to the family above the \$100/\$200 Federal disregard maximum



Keeping Busy

- SB 1055: Drivers License suspension and revocation changes effective January 1, 2025
- Uncollectable Debt and Collectability Study
- Equity Audit and Equity Grant
- Focus on Increasing Data Sources
 - CalSAWS
 - DOJ and CLEAR incarceration and criminal history
 - Gig Work focus
 - Researching and tracking outcomes utilizing known demographics
