38 39 40 41 42 43		A judge on <u>unpaid</u> sabbatical leave is subject to the California Code of Judicial Ethics and, while on a paid sabbatical, must not accept <u>may receive</u> compensation <u>and reimbursement for expenses</u> for activities performed during that sabbatical leave <u>but may receive reimbursement for the expenses</u> <u>as provided in canon 4H(2)</u> of the Code of Judicial Ethics.
