# PLAINTIFF AND APPELLANT'S AMENDED MOTION FOR JUDICIAL NOTICE

IN THE SUPPEME COURT OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Plaintiff and Appellant Beacon Residential Community Association ("BRCA") hereby submits this amended motion, and moves, in compliance with California Rules of Court, Rule 8.520(g) and Rule 8.252(a), for the Court to take judicial notice that a "Keystone wall" is one of various types of retaining walls made of interlocking masonry units, that are sold by Keystone Retaining Wall Systems LLC ("Keystone"), and that have standardized structural details published by Keystone.

The relevance of this request for judicial notice is that the Court of Appeal opinion in the case of Weseloh Family Ltd. Partnership v. K.L. Wessell Construction Co., Inc. (2004) 125 Cal.App.4<sup>th</sup> 152 (Weseloh) mentions twice that certain engineers involved in that case provided designs for "Keystone walls" (id., at pp. 159, 166) but the opinion in Weseloh provides no further explanation or background on the nature of "Keystone walls." In order to understand the holding of Weseloh, it may be helpful for this Court to take notice of the standardized nature of "Keystone wall" designs. There is no reason to conclude that the fundamentally standardized nature of "Keystone wall" designs is materially different now than it was in 2004 when Weseloh was decided.

Judicial notice regarding "Keystone walls" was not requested by Appellant in the trial court. The nature of a "Keystone wall" has no relevance or involvement whatever to the present case. Thus, while the case was before the trial court, Appellant did not realize that there was any need to request judicial notice of the nature of "Keystone walls." "Keystone walls" are mentioned twice, without explanation, in the Weseloh opinion. However, after the time when this case was briefed and argued in the trial court, including, in Respondents' Petition for Review and Opening Brief, Respondents' have placed great emphasis on Weseloh, a decision never cited by this Court. This requires this Court to, at least potentially, understand otherwise minor details of Weseloh, as Weseloh is a decision affirming a trial court summary judgment, whose holding is explicitly highly dependent on the developed factual record in that case. For this reason, Appellant has submitted this motion for judicial notice to provide the Court with a proper basis to take judicial notice, should the Court conclude that it is important to analyze the facts of Weseloh in depth.

This Court has authority to take judicial notice. (E.g., *Reynolds* v. *Bement* (2005) 36 Cal.4<sup>th</sup> 1075, 1083.) Judicial notice is proper,

pursuant to Evidence Code § 452(h), in that the nature of "Keystone walls" is a fact or proposition not reasonably subject to dispute and that is capable of immediate and accurate determination by resort to a source of reasonably indisputable accuracy, namely, the on-line "web site" published by Keystone Retaining Wall Systems, LLC. The Keystone web site generally illustrates the walls constructed of interlocking masonry units made by Keystone that are known as "Keystone" walls, that is, a wall whose masonry pieces fit together like pieces of a puzzle. Keystone publishes, on its web site, standardized structural designs for use when Keystone walls are used as retaining walls.

According to the "Keystone walls" web site referenced below, and reprinted in the Attachment A to this Motion, Keystone publishes "typical cad details to assist you when designing your site."

Attached to this Motion, pursuant to Evidence Code § 459, are the following:

a. A print out of the "CAD Details -- PDF" tab underneath "CAD Details" and "Technical Info" on the website entitled www.keystonewalls.com.

b. Two sample print outs of standard retaining wall details which are listed on that page.

These retaining wall details for Keystone walls, and other standard Keystone wall details like it, may be viewed, downloaded, and printed by anyone with internet access, by going to the <a href="https://www.keystonewalls.com">www.keystonewalls.com</a> web page, and then clicking the "technical info" tab. Underneath that tab there are sub-tabs for "CAD details" and "CAD details – PDF." This is the source where the materials in the Attachment A were obtained.




