#### Zero-tolerance policies...aren't working



- Out-of-School Suspensions and Expulsions are given for <u>mundane</u> and <u>non-violent infractions</u>.
- Two decades, Study shows no evidence that removing students from school, improves school safety or student behavior.

New York (2001) 29,000 student suspensions – (2011) 71,000 student suspensions

Pipeline to Prison...Minority and Poverty students disproportantly suspened from school ...leads to prison




• Toxic stress impacts the brain's ability to learn.

- The brain is flooded with the chemical <u>"Cortisol".</u> Cortisol is for any time that we find ourselves in a "<u>Fight, Flight,</u> or <u>Freeze</u>.
- The brain cannot physiologically take in new knowledge or problem-solve.

## How Trauma Impacts School Performance

- ➤ Lower GPA
- > Higher rate of school absences
- > Increased drop-out rate
- > Higher suspensions and expulsions
- > Performing below grade level in Reading.
- > Impacts memory
- > Reduces ability to focus and organize
- Hinders processing of information, some can not do abstract concepts...state math standard
- Interferes with problem solving and fitting into the traditional classroom.

#### ACE Study: a paradigm shift

The ACE Study takes a whole-life perspective, as indicated on the orange arrow leading from conception to death. By working within this framework, the ACE Study began to progressively uncover how adverse childhood experiences (ACEs) are strongly related to development and prevalence of risk factors for disease and health and social well-being throughout their life spans.



## What are the 10 Adverse Childhood Experiences?

- 1. Child sexual abuse
- 2. Child emotional abuse
- 3. Physical neglect
- 4. Emotional neglect
- 5. Mentally ill, depressed or suicidal person in the home
- 6. Drug-addicted or alcoholic family member
- 7. Witnessing domestic violence against the mother
- 8. Loss of a parent to death or abandonment, including abandonment by divorce
- 9. Child physical abuse
- 10.Incarceration of any family member

### Adverse Childhood Experiences

- The greatest single predictor for
  - Health
  - Attendance
  - Behavior
  - Academic failure/after special education.
- The relationship between academic achievement and health status <u>appears much less related to</u> <u>income than to ACEs.</u>





#### Use a <u>trauma lens</u> to better understand a student's behavior


A shift in perspective from "What is wrong with this student?" to "What has this student been through?"

They were connected to a caring adult who believed in them and cared about them.


Teachers were the most frequently endorsed adult that made a powerful impact on their direction in life.








