The documents for which notice is sought do not relate to proceedings occurring after the Court of Appeal's judgment and were not presented to the trial court or the appellate court in this case.

I. The submitted documents are subject to judicial notice.

The excerpted provisions of county code attached as Exhibit 1 incorporate the well-construction standards set forth in Bulletin No. 74 that are the subject of this litigation. Judicial notice of these excerpts is proper under the California Rules of Court and the Evidence Code.

Under Rules 8.520(g) and 8.252(a) of the Rules of Court and Evidence Code section 459(a), this Court shall take notice of each matter the trial court was required to notice under sections 451 or 453. Additionally, this Court may take judicial notice of any matter subject to judicial notice under Evidence Code section 452. (Evid. Code § 459(a).) Although the documents for which the County is requesting judicial notice were not presented to the trial court or the Court of Appeal, they are properly subject to judicial notice under Rule 8.252(a).

Judicial notice of the submitted documents is proper under Evidence Code section 451(a), which requires that judicial notice be taken of the "decisional, constitutional, and public statutory law of this state." Because counties are legal subdivisions of the state, their statutory law as codified in county codes constitutes the "public statutory law of the state" under Evidence Code section 451(a). (See Cal. Const., art. XI, § 1(a).) Accordingly, courts have relied on section 451 to take judicial notice of county code provisions. (See Resource Defense Fund v. County of Santa Cruz

(1982) 133 Cal.App.3d 800, 806, fn. 6 [taking judicial notice of "photographic copies of pertinent county code provisions" pursuant to Evid. Code § 451 et seq.].)

The submitted documents are also subject to permissive judicial notice under Evidence Code section 452. This section authorizes courts to take judicial notice of "legislative enactments issued by or under the authority of . . . any public entity in the United States" (Evid. Code § 452(b)), "[o]fficial acts of the legislative, executive, and judicial departments . . . of any state of the United States" (id. § 452(c)), and "[f]acts and propositions that are not reasonably subject to dispute and are capable of immediate and accurate determination by resort to sources of reasonably indisputable accuracy" (id. § 452(h)).

This Court has taken judicial notice of legislative enactments of local agencies, including ordinances, pursuant to Evidence Code section 452(b). (See, e.g., Longshore v. County of Ventura (1979) 25 Cal.3d 14, 24 [taking judicial notice of county ordinances pursuant to Evid. Code § 452(b)]; see also Desmond v. County of Contra Costa (1993) 21 Cal.App.4th 330, 336.) Similarly, courts have taken judicial notice of county records, including resolutions, under section 452(c) on the grounds that "counties are legal subdivisions of the state." (Cooke v. Superior Court (1989) 213 Cal.App.3d 401, 416 (citing Edna Valley Assn. v. San Luis Obispo County and Cities Area Planning Coordinating Council (1977) 67 Cal.App.3d 444, 449-50).) Finally, section 452(h) applies to the documents submitted here because these are publicly available,

and thus "capable of immediate and accurate determination." (Evid. Code § 452(h).)

Exhibit 1 excerpts sections of county code that have been enacted and published by the counties listed above. Each excerpted code section regulates the construction of groundwater wells, incorporating the well-construction standards set forth in *Bulletin No. 74, California Well Standards*, which are at issue in this litigation. Each of the excerpts is an official, legislative act and a record of the legislative body of the county at issue.

Each county listed above is a public entity in the United States and a subdivision of the State of California. Furthermore, the enactment and contents of each exhibit are not reasonably subject to dispute and are capable of immediate and accurate determination. The exhibit attached here is therefore judicially noticeable under Evidence Code section 451(a), as well as under section 452(b), (c), and (h).

II. The exhibit is relevant to the issues before this Court.

Exhibit 1 is relevant to the issues before this Court because it supports the County's contention that, if the state Bulletin standards are determined to be discretionary in whole or in part, such a finding will have sweeping practical consequences for the vast majority of counties in the state. Because the 46 counties represented in the exhibit incorporate the state Bulletin standards in their well permitting ordinances in a manner similar to Stanislaus County, the Court's decision about the nature of the

Stanislaus County ordinance and the state Bulletin standards will affect the permitting processes for these 46 counties.

Standards for the construction, repair, modification or destruction of wells shall be as set forth in Chapter II of the California Department of Water Resources Bulletin No. 74, "Water Well Standards," state of California, with the following exceptions:

A. All community water supply wells and individual domestic wells shall be provided with a pipe or other effective means through which chlorine or other disinfecting agents may be introduced directly into the well. The pipe, if provided, shall be installed at a height equal to the pump slab or at least six inches above the finished grade, shall be kept sealed, and shall be provided with a threaded or equivalently secure cap (in a well pit, the pipe shall be twelve inches above the floor of the pit). Equivalent protection for excluding contamination from the well

shall be provided for subsurface pump discharge installations. If an air relief vent is used, it shall terminate downward twelve inches above ground level and be screened and protected against contamination material entering the vent (sixteen-mesh screen).

B. Every new, repaired or modified community water supply well or domestic water well, after construction, modification or repair, and before being placed into service, shall be thoroughly cleaned of all foreign substance and shall be thoroughly disinfected. Procedures delineated in Appendix E of the aforementioned Department of Water Resources Bulletin No. 74, state of California, or equivalent, are required. (Ord. 364 § 7, 1976)

In no case shall the depth of the annular seal or the depth of the first perforations be reduced to less than twenty (20) feet below ground surface.
 - a. Corcoran Clay. All wells penetrating Corcoran clay shall be constructed in a manner such as to prevent the intermixing of water above and below the Corcoran clay layer. There shall be no perforations above and below the Corcoran clay layer in the same casing. There shall be no gravel pack installed above and below the Corcoran clay layer in the same borehole.
