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
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WHY DOES THIS MATTER?
SUSPENSIONS AND EXPULSIONS MAKE MATTERS WORSE



- ★ High rates of out-of-school suspensions correlate with lower achievement scores, even after controlling for race and poverty.
- ★ Suspended or expelled students
  - × 6 times more likely to repeat a grade
  - × 5 times more likely to dropout
  - × 3 times more likely to have contact with juvenile justice system
- ➤ Suspension for low-level misbehavior doesn't improve behavior or school climate and sends youth to unsupervised vacation



#### WHY DOES THIS MATTER?

- ∴ One arrest 2x likelihood of dropout
- ★ One court appearance nearly 4x likelihood of dropout
- ★ Juvenile incarceration data nearly mirrors state suspension and expulsion data with % of subgroups

# TARGETING SUPPORT FOR VULNERABLE YOUTH

- The connection between foster youth, trauma and school climate:
- ★ 48% of youth in foster care struggle with emotional or behavioral issues.
- × 25.2% of foster youth alumni experienced PTSD, up to double the rate of U.S. combat veterans
- ★ 67% of foster youth have been suspended at least once
- 1/6 of foster youth had been expelled compared to 5% of the general population



Systemic racism must be confronted as a fundamental component of our education system and criminal justice system. We cannot transform these systems unless students and families most impacted by these basic human rights violations lead us.




## STATEWIDE EDUCATION RIGHTS PROJECT

- ≥ 2007 CADRE parents lead fight to pass SWPBIS policy in LAUSD
- ≈ 2017 follow up Shadow Report on 10year anniversary of SWPBIS in LAUSD:
  - Persistent racial disparities in South LA school
  - Very limited implementation that includes Parents
