17 THE COURT: AS YOU BOTH KNOW, ON THE LAST COURT
 18 APPEARANCE ON THIS, BOTH SIDES STIPULATED THAT THEY
 19 AGREED I SHOULD GRANT THE MOTION. THERE HAVE BEEN TWO
 20 PROBLEMS. NUMBER ONE, VENTURA HASN'T SENT THEIR FILE,
 21 AND NUMBER 2, THE CHARGE HAS NOTHING TO DO WITH BEING
 22 A VICTIM OF SEXUAL TRADE. IT WAS A DRUNK DRIVING. A
 23 LONG DRUNK DRIVING PROCEDURE WHERE SHE ACTUALLY WENT
 24 TO TRIAL ON IT. SO THAT WOULD NOT FALL UNDER THE LAW
 25 TO CONSOLIDATE AND TO DISMISS IT.

26 MS. BRADLEY: YOUR HONOR, IF WE MAY. IT IS
 27 ACTUALLY RELATED TO THE TRAFFICKING. IT WAS HER
 28 TRAFFICKER WHO GAVE HER THAT CALL THAT DEMANDED SHE BE

1 THERE. GIVEN THE SITUATION SHE WAS IN, UNDER THREAT
2 OF PHYSICAL AND EMOTIONAL BEATINGS AS WELL, SHE
3 RESPONDED IMMEDIATELY TO TRY TO GET BACK INTO --

4 THE COURT: IN VENTURA COUNTY?

5 MS. BRADLEY: YES. AND THE VENTURA COUNTY DA
6 DID ACTUALLY SUBMIT A LETTER STIPULATING THAT THEY DO
7 FIND THAT STORY CREDIBLE AND DIRECTLY RELATED.

8 THE COURT: GIVE US THE FILE. OUR OWN CLERK
9 CALLED, RIGHT THE SAME DAY.

10 MR. TRUONG: THIS LEGISLATION IS ALL NEW.
11 EVERYBODY IS TRYING TO FIGURE IT OUT.

12 THE COURT: ANYTHING. EVEN THE FRONT PAGE OF
13 THE FILE.

14 MR. TRUONG: WE HAD COMMUNICATION FROM LAURIE
15 JACK, THE JUDICIAL SECRETARY FROM VENTURA SUPERIOR
16 COURT, JUDGE HIRSCH, IN DEPARTMENT 10, AND SO THEY HAD
17 SEEN THE PETITION. THEY HAD WONDERED WHAT WAS GOING
18 ON, AND WE SAID WE HAD STIPULATED TO CONSOLIDATE INTO
19 ONE HEARING. THEY SAID OKAY, WE ARE NOT GOING TO TAKE
20 ANY ACTION. LET US KNOW WHAT HAPPENS. IT'S DATED
21 AUGUST 15TH.

22 THE COURT: OKAY. IS IT A FORMAL CORRESPONDENCE
23 OR AN E-MAIL?

24 MR. TRUONG: E-MAIL.

25 THE COURT: DO YOU HAVE A COPY OF THAT?

26 MR. TRUONG: YES, YOUR HONOR.

27 THE COURT: ANYTHING I CAN USE. ANY PORT IN THE
28 STORM IS THE OLD SAYING.

1 MR. TRUONG: THE VENTURA DA IS ESSENTIALLY
2 SUBMITTING TO THE COURT'S RULING.

3 THE COURT: THEY DIDN'T KNOW WHAT TO DO IN OTHER
4 WORDS.

5 MR. TRUONG: THEY DIDN'T SEE ANY INDICATION IN
6 THE DUI REPORT TO TRAFFICKING. IN THE CONTEXT OF THIS
7 LEGISLATION, THERE ARE REASONS WHY THE VICTIM AT THAT
8 POINT IN TIME WOULD NOT BE TALKING ABOUT THEIR
9 TRAFFICKING SITUATION.

10 THE COURT: I WILL GIVE YOU BACK THE ORIGINALS
11 AS WELL. THE COURT HAS OFFICIAL COPIES OF THE
12 CORRESPONDENCE BETWEEN THE CITY ATTORNEY'S OFFICE IN
13 LOS ANGELES AND THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE IN
14 VENTURA COUNTY. WHEN WE LAST DID THIS MOTION ON JULY
15 17TH, I WAS 100 PERCENT ON BOARD. WHEN I DIDN'T SEE
16 ANY DOCUMENTS FROM VENTURA OR ANY REPLY FROM THEM, IT
17 CAUSED ME TO GO INTO THE VENTURA COUNTY FILE THAT WAS
18 HERE. IT'S A XEROX COPY OF THE PROCEDURES. THAT IS
19 WHEN I SAW THAT IT WAS A DRUNK DRIVING CASE.

20 AS I SAID, I SAW A DUI I THOUGHT YOU
21 COULDN'T CONSOLIDATE. THEN I REMEMBER READING
22 SOMETHING IN THE AFFIDAVIT THAT SHOWED THE CONDITIONS
23 UNDER WHICH THE DUI OCCURRED, OR SOMETHING TO DO WITH
24 THE PERSON WHO WAS TAKING ADVANTAGE OF [REDACTED]
25 OBVIOUSLY I WANTED TO FIND ANYWAY I COULD TO GRANT THE
26 MOTION, BUT I FOUND THAT I COULDN'T IF IT WAS A DUI.

27 WHAT YOU HAVE DONE, BOTH COUNSEL, IS
28 REALLY ASSISTED ME IN GRANTING A MOTION THAT I WANTED

1 TO GRANT. WITHOUT BOTH OF YOUR WORD, I DIDN'T FEEL
2 LEGALLY I COULD DO IT. NOW THAT I CAN, THIS IS
3 TOTALLY NEW, AND WHAT I AM GOING TO DO ON BOTH THE
4 PLEAS ENTERED IN -- THERE IS NO STAMP FOR THIS. I
5 HAVE TO WRITE IT OUT. PLEASE ENTER IN CASE NUMBER
6 [REDACTED] IN LOS ANGELES, AND IT WAS A NO CONTEST IN
7 VENTURA, THAT IS NUMBER [REDACTED] ARE HEREBY -- I
8 HAVEN'T READ THIS YET -- ARE HEREBY SET ASIDE. THE
9 NEW PLEA IS ENTERED OF NOT GUILTY. THE CASES ARE
10 DISMISSED PURSUANT TO 236.14H3 AND 1385 OF THE PENAL
11 CODE, AND THE CASES ARE ORDERED SEALED.

12 MY STATEMENT WOULD BE THAT THE BENEFITS OF
13 THE NEW DIVERSION SECTIONS WHICH ARE 1001.96 HAS THE
14 FOLLOWING LANGUAGE: THE ARREST UPON WHICH SENTENCING
15 OCCURRED IN THE TWO ABOVE CASES IS DEEMED TO HAVE
16 NEVER OCCURRED. THE DEFENDANT MAY INDICATE IN
17 RESPONSE TO ANY QUESTION CONCERNING HIS OR HER PRIOR
18 CRIMINAL RECORD THAT HE OR SHE WAS NOT ARRESTED OR
19 GRANTED DEFERRED ENTRY OF JUDGEMENT FOR THE OFFENSE
20 EXCEPT AS SPECIFIED. THAT WOULD BE IF YOU ARE GOING
21 TO APPLY TO BE IN LAW ENFORCEMENT, A POLICE OFFICER,
22 OR WORK FOR THE LOTTERY, YOU HAVE TO DISCLOSE IT.

23 A RECORD PERTAINING TO AN ARREST RESULTING
24 IN SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF THE TERMS OF HER PROBATION
25 CANNOT BE USED IN ANY WAY THAT COULD RESULT IN DENIAL
26 OF EMPLOYMENT, BENEFIT OF LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE.

27 SO NOW YOU DO NOT HAVE TO DISCLOSE THE
28 ARREST, AND YOU CANNOT BE DENIED EMPLOYMENT, LICENSE,

1 OR CERTIFICATE.

2 THE COURT WILL ORDER A COPY OF THIS
3 TRANSCRIPT FOR FUTURE PURPOSES. IF ANYONE GIVES HER
4 ANY TROUBLE ON IT, BECAUSE IT'S SO NEW, EMPLOYERS
5 AREN'T GOING TO KNOW, AND PERHAPS AN OFFICIAL COURT
6 TRANSCRIPT WOULD BE IMPORTANT.
