








FRAGMENTATION OF DEVELOPING SELF

Assessment, Treatment and Intervention Assessment Self Worth, Competence and Industry Safety, Connection, Self Worth, Competence and Industry Improved Health, Wellbeing and Future

STEPS

- 1. Address immediate needs first.
- 2. Develop a collaborative plan.
- 3. Expectations and supports.
- 4. Effective services.
- 5. Follow up, reinforcement and praise.
- 6. Completion.

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES NEED TO INCLUDE:

- Youth need to respected, informed, connected and hopeful in their own recovery
- The interrelation between trauma and symptoms of trauma such as substance abuse, eating disorders, depression, and anxiety
- The need to work in a collaborative way with survivors, family and friends of the survivor, and other human services agencies in a manner that will empower survivors and consumers
