	I. NURTURING						
	<i>Shared Affection/Participation</i>						
1	Gives me hugs and kisses						
2	Says things that make me feel special						
3	I like giving my parents hugs and kisses						
4	Helps me enjoy spending time with him/her						
5	Drives me and my friends places we want to go						
6	Visits my school and comes to my sports activities						
7	Plays games and sports with me						
8	Watches TV/movies with me						
	<i>Responsiveness</i>						
9	Is a good listener when I feel sad						
10	Understands how I feel about his/her girlfriend/boyfriend						
11	Comforts me when my feelings are hurt						

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	My Mom / My Dad	A	B	C	D	F	Examples:
12	Does not embarrass me in front of my friends						
13	Is kind when I feel sick						
14	Sets aside time when I need him/her to talk						
	<i>Protection</i>						
15	Makes me wear sunscreen and protective sports gear on bicycles, ATV's, rollerblades, etc						
16	Makes me feel safe when I am at home or in a car with him/her						
17	Does not say sexual things that make me feel uncomfortable						
18	Has nutritious food around the house						
19	Does not yell at me						
20	Has a savings account for me						
21	Understands when something is too difficult for me to do						
22	Is good at helping me try new things which frighten me						
	II. TEACHING						
	<i>Communication with Child</i>						
23	Has heart-to-heart talks with me about what is right and wrong						
24	Teaches me how to respond to emergencies like if somebody gets sick or hurt, if I'm locked out of the house, when a stranger tries to talk to me						
25	Explains human sexuality to me						

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	My Mom / My Dad	A	B	C	D	F	Examples:
26	Listens to what I say carefully when we have an argument						
27	Makes it easy to talk to about my problems						
28	Makes it easy to talk comfortably with him/her about my other parent						
	<i>Managing/Supervising</i>						
29	Takes me to special learning activities like museums, national parks, theatre plays, puppet shows and stuff like that						
30	Knows what movies I watch or what computer sites I visit						
31	Knows what my teachers are like and what is going on at school						
32	Knows if I am getting along good with teachers, coaches and friends						
33	Talks with me about what to do or say to bullies and friends who are mean to me						
	<i>Discipline</i>						
34	Stays calm and does not get angry when I break a rule						
35	Talks to me calmly when I get in trouble so I learn to make better choices						
36	Does not hit, punch, slap or grab me						
37	Gives consequences and punishments that are fair when I break a rule

38	I know he/she means it if they say I have to do something						
39	Is nice, not bossy or mean, when telling me to do things						
	<i>Modeling</i>						
40	Usually is in a happy mood						
41	Calms down quickly when he/she gets upset						
42	Does not smoke cigarettes or drink too much alcohol						
43	Is patient						
44	Can be counted on to do what he/she says they will do						
45	Apologizes to me when he/she makes a mistake						
46	Respects my privacy: for example, does not go through my personal journal or phone history						
47	Does not say mean things about other people, including minority groups such as Blacks, Jews, Hispanics, Arabs, Gays						
	III. CO-PARENTING						
	<i>Communication with Co-Parent</i>						
48	Keeps my other parent informed about my activities, school grades, friends, school, etc.						
49	Is friendly at doctor appointments when my other parent is there						

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	My Mom / My Dad	A	B	C	D	F	Examples:
50	Is friendly to my other parent when they meet at school and when he/she calls on the phone						
51	Tells me I can take my stuff between houses if I want to						
	<i>Supporting</i>						
52	Tells me to telephone or text my other parent and to return their phone calls						
53	Does not get angry at my other parent when I am close enough to hear						
54	Does not ask questions about my other parent's private life						
55	Does not make me talk about which home I want to spend most of my time in						
56	Helps me to send cards or gifts to my other parent for holidays, birthdays, when they are sick						
57	Does not tell me to keep secrets from my other parent						
58	Talks about my other parent in kind and loving ways						
59	Makes nice comments about the gifts and cards I get from my other parent						
60	Is on time to pick me up at exchanges						
61	Enjoys himself/herself while I am with my other parent						

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	My Mom / My Dad	A	B	C	D	F	Examples:
62	Compliments me on how I resemble my other parent, for example: "You have beautiful hair like your mother"						
63	Encourages me to pray for my other parent						
64	Keeps pictures of my other parent at his/her home						
65	Wants me to have good relationships with relatives on both sides of the family						
66	Changes the parenting schedule so that I can attend special activities
