## **Judicial Concerns for NonMinor Dependents**

- 1. Know the date of dependent or ward's 18<sup>th</sup> birthday
- 2. Know the law
- 3. Follow the required findings and orders at each hearing
- 4. Although you may become frustrated with a youth, remember that you cannot ground him or her or restrict cell phone or IPad use.
- 5. Make sure ALL the reports provide ALL the required information
- 6. NEVER lose sight of the goals of the legislation; i.e. permanence and lifelong connections
- 7. Make sure the NMD is present at every hearing in person or by phone, absent unusual circumstances
- 8. Conduct the hearings informally, but always bearing in mind that the NMD is now an ADULT!
- 9. Know the community and the services that may be available

- 10. Remember that these are the youth the system took responsible for raising and preparing, and the job isn't over.
- 11. Acknowledge that this is a tough job for social workers and probation officers whose training rarely included dealing with this population at this point in the youth's lives.
- 12. Remember why everyone said don't take that Juvenile Court assignment and why you're glad you did anyway.
