EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

he 2004 Judicial Council Court Statistics Report is published electronically by the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) to improve access to, and enhance the usability of, state court workload data. The report contains 10-year statewide trend data as well as fiscal year 2002–2003 data for individual counties. (With a few exceptions, the printed version of the report contains only statewide data while the electronic version, available online, contains both statewide and individual county data.)

The statistical report is a companion to the 2004 Judicial Council Annual Report, which highlights judicial branch programs designed to improve public access, fairness, and accountability in court administration.

The 2004 Judicial Council Court Statistics Report is prepared under the provisions of section 6 of article VI of the California Constitution, which requires the Judicial Council to survey the condition of business in state courts and to report and make recommendations to the Governor and Legislature.

PRINCIPAL FINDINGS

Court filing and disposition data represent key measures of court workload, but other factors also must be considered. For example, complex cases involve numerous court appearances and actions, while simple cases are often resolved in a single appearance of a few minutes. Yet both types of cases are counted as filings and thus appear equal statistically. Examples of complex, high-workload cases include felonies, personal injury lawsuits, family law matters, and juvenile cases.

Following are summaries of the principal findings for the Supreme Court, Courts of Appeal, superior courts, and judicial assignments.

SUPREME COURT

- Total filings declined slightly from the previous year, with 8,862 filings in 2002–2003 compared with 8,917 in 2001–2002.
- Dispositions fell by almost 2 percent, from 8,802 in 2001–2002 to 8,652 in 2002–2003.
- Twenty-seven automatic appeals (death penalty cases) were disposed of in 2002–2003, an increase of almost 28 percent from 2001–2002.
- Filings of original proceedings remained unchanged from the previous year at 3,074.
- The number of written opinions increased sharply, from 101 in 2001–2002 to 123 in 2002–2003.
- After rising steadily for three years, habeas corpus petitions held steady in 2002–2003, with 237 filings compared to 238 in 2001–2002.
- The number of habeas petitions related to automatic appeals almost doubled, increasing from 30 in 2001– 2002 to 59 in 2002–2003.
- The Supreme Court in 2002–2003 ordered 17 Court of Appeal opinions depublished—the lowest number of depublished opinions in over 20 years.

COURTS OF APPEAL

A total of 22,043 records of appeal and original proceedings were filed in the Courts of Appeal in 2002–2003, a 1.5 percent drop from the previous year and a return to the level of the early 1990s.

- Filings of records of appeal dropped slightly from 13,925 in 2001–2002 to 13,437 in 2002–2003. Civil record of appeal filings fell by 9 percent, and juvenile appeals fell by 6 percent. Criminal record of appeal filings, in contrast, rose by just over 2 percent.
- Total filings of original proceedings rose by almost 2 percent to 8,606 cases in 2002– 2003. Civil original proceedings rose the most, by more than 4 percent. Juvenile original proceedings rose by just over 2 percent, while criminal filings of original proceedings remained relatively stable.
- Total dispositions decreased by 1 percent from the previous year.

- Written opinions decreased by less than 1 percent to 12,543 cases in 2002–2003.
- Among cases disposed of by written opinion, there was little change in the proportions of cases affirmed, reversed, and dismissed.
- The publication rate of opinions remained stable at 7 percent.

SUPERIOR COURTS

- Superior court filings fell slightly, from 8,395,432 in 2001–2002 to 7,994,149 in 2002–2003.
- There were 7,207,124 dispositions in 2002–2003, also a decline from the number in 2001–2002.
- Civil case filings remained virtually unchanged, dipping slightly from 1,554,058 in 2001–2002 to 1,501,472 in 2002–2003, but up slightly from 2000–2001.
- Juvenile delinquency filings also fell in 2002–2003. Original petitions fell by almost 4 percent, and subsequent petitions dropped by 551—about 2 percent.
- Juvenile dependency filings were also effectively unchanged, rising by 12 filings from the previous year. While the number of original juvenile dependency filings increased by 60 in 2002–2003, the number of subsequent filings declined by 48.

- Although jury trials declined by almost 4 percent to 11,517 in 2002–2003, this decline was driven entirely by a drop in the number of misdemeanor and limited civil jury trials. During the same period, jury trials increased by 7 percent for felony and personal injury cases and by 6 percent for unlimited civil cases.
- Civil case processing time remained the same. In 2002–2003, 65 percent of unlimited civil cases and 90 percent of limited civil cases were disposed of within one year.
- Criminal case processing time did not change significantly, with 90 percent of all felonies being disposed of in less than 12 months.

JUDICIAL ASSIGNMENTS

- As calculated for purposes of estimated judicial resources in the courts, retired judges and trial court judges provided a total of 23,078 days of judicial assistance in 2002–2003, a 10 percent decline from the previous fiscal year.
- Almost 99 percent of judicial assistance was provided to the superior courts; the remainder went to the Courts of Appeal.

California Judicial Branch

The California court system, with more than 2,000 judicial officers, 19,000 court employees, and nearly 8 million cases in over 451 court locations, and a 2002-2003 budget of \$2.64 billion, serves over 34 million people—12.2 percent of the total U.S. population.




FIGURE 1—Filings



- This ratio is a measure of pending workload as well as judicial productivity and is an estimate of the time a court needs to dispose of pending fully briefed appeals. A ratio of 100 is equivalent to one year, 50 is equivalent to six months, and so forth. The estimate is based on the assumption that the court will decide the same number of appeals in 2003–04 as in 2002–03.
- The Second District had 25 fully briefed appeals per 100 appeals disposed of by opinion in 2002–03, the lowest ratio among the six appellate districts. Given the assumption just noted, it would take three months for the court to dispose of its pending fully briefed appeals.
- The Sixth District had 41 pending fully briefed appeals per 100 appeals disposed of by opinion, the highest ratio among the six appellate districts.
- The statewide average decreased from 33 in 2001–02 to 31 in 2002–03.




- "Judge equivalent" refers to the number of authorized justices—adjusted for judicial vacancies, assistance given to other courts, and judicial assistance received.
- The statewide average opinions per judge equivalent were 121 in 2002–03, compared to 130 in 2001–02.
- The Fifth District reported the highest rate, 152 opinions per judge equivalent— 26 percent higher than the statewide average.
- The First District reported the lowest opinion rate, 86 per judge equivalent. However, the First District had the lowest number of pending fully briefed appeals per authorized justice. The lower disposition rate may reflect that fewer cases are available for the justices.
- Beyond an optimum number of opinions (not yet identified), high rates of disposition indicate overload and a need for additional judgeships.

FIGURE 2—Pending Fully Briefed Appeals per Authorized Justice As of June 30, 2003





FIGURE 3—Majority Opinions per Judge Equivalent Appeals and Original Proceedings Fiscal Year 2002–03





- The white portions of the bars represent the medians. The entire length of each bar (white and gray portions) represents the 90th percentile. "Median time" refers to the value at which half of the cases fall above and half below. The 90th percentile time is the value at which 10 percent of the cases fall above and 90 percent fall below.
- The statewide median time from appeal to filing of opinion for civil appeals was 487 days in 2002–03, compared to 481 days in 2001–02; the 90th percentile time was 724 days in 2002–03, compared to 861 days in 2001–02.
- Division Three of the Fourth District reported 892 days, the longest 90th percentile time from notice of appeal to filing of opinion for civil appeals disposed of in 2002–03.
- Division Five of the First District had the shortest 90th percentile time for civil appeals, 548 days.

- The statewide median time from appeal to filing of opinion for criminal appeals was 405 days in 2002–03, compared to 397 days in 2001–02; the 90th percentile time was 676 days in 2002–03, compared to 693 days in 2001–02.
- Division Three of the Fourth District reported 917 days, the longest 90th percentile time from notice of appeal to filing of opinion for criminal appeals disposed of in 2002–03.
- Division Six of the Second District had the shortest 90th percentile time for criminal appeals, 502 days.



- The Third District had the highest level of pending appeals per justice as of June 30, 2003—19 percent higher than the statewide average.
- The Second District had the highest level of filings and the Third District had the highest level of dispositions per justice in 2002–03. FIGURE 7—Original Proceeding Filings in All Districts Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03




FIGURE 8—Record of Appeal Filings in the First District Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03




FIGURE 9—Record of Appeal Filings in the Second District Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03




FIGURE 10—Record of Appeal Filings in the Third District Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03




FIGURE 11—Record of Appeal Filings in the Fourth District Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03




FIGURE 12—Record of Appeal Filings in the Fifth District Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03





FIGURE 13—Record of Appeal Filings in the Sixth District Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03

Superior Courts

Changes to Superior Courts Table 4, Civil Filings and Dispositions

Table 4 on page 50 was updated as part of the gradual phase-in of the new statewide electronic reporting system, the Judicial Branch Statistical Information System (JBSIS). JBSIS defines standards for the monthly collection of court caseload, caseflow, and workload and the reporting of these data to the Judicial Council (Cal. Rules of Court, rule 996). These standards are implemented in case management systems and are captured as a byproduct of case processing.

Since there is not always a one-to-one relationship between the old standards and JBSIS, the annual court statistics tables are being redesigned incrementally. This year the changes affect the headings and grouping of cases in the other civil petitions, other civil complaints, and family law categories of Table 4.

Family law has been divided into two columns: column *F* for marital cases (dissolutions, separations, and nullities) and column *G* for family law petitions, which consist of a wide range of miscellaneous family law case types.

Under the old standards, the majority of cases under "Other civil petitions" were filings from the Department of Child Support Services. Because of past statutory changes, these no longer are considered civil petitions and now fall into the family law category (JBSIS Report 06a). They will be reported under "Other family law petitions" in the *Court Statistics Report* for the time being.

Column *E* is now more in line with the definition for "other civil complaints and petitions" in JBSIS Reports 05a and 05b.

Changes to Superior Courts Tables 11 and 11d, Civil and Small Claims Appeals

Column H on Table 11 shows totals for the filing and disposition of civil appeals. These totals include small claims appeals which are set out in further detail on Table 11d.

FIGURE 1—Total Filings per Judicial Position and Dispositions per Judicial Position Equivalent Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03





FIGURE 2—Total Filings and Dispositions Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03

FIGURE 7—Limited Civil Filings and Dispositions* Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03





FIGURE 8—Small Claims Filings and Dispositions Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03

FIGURE 9—Felony Filings and Dispositions Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03




FIGURE 10—Nontraffic Misdemeanor Filings and Dispositions Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03




FIGURE 11—Traffic Misdemeanor Filings and Dispositions Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03





FIGURE 12—Traffic Infraction Filings and Dispositions Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03

FIGURE 13—Juvenile Delinquency Filings and Dispositions Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03




FIGURE 14—Juvenile Dependency Filings and Dispositions Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03




FIGURE 15—Mental Health Filings and Dispositions Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03





FIGURE 16—Appeal Filings and Dispositions Fiscal Years 1993–94 Through 2002–03


