Executive Summary

The chairs of three Judicial Council internal committees, the Policy Coordination and Liaison Committee, Executive and Planning Committee, and Rules and Projects Committee, recommend that the council approve the recommended recipients of the 2012 Judicial Council of California Distinguished Service Awards. These annual awards, the highest honors bestowed by the judicial branch, recognize individuals who exemplify the leadership strengths that create significant and positive contributions to court administration in California. Following council approval, the awards will be presented on a date and at an event to be determined.

Recommendation

The chairs of the Policy Coordination and Liaison Committee, the Executive and Planning Committee, and the Rules and Projects Committee recommend that the Judicial Council approve the recipients of the 2012 Distinguished Service Awards—the Ronald M. George Award for Judicial Excellence, the William C. Vickrey Leadership in Judicial Administration Award, the Bernard E. Witkin Amicus Curiae Award, the Stanley Mosk Defender of Justice Award, and the Richard D. Huffman Justice for Children & Families Award—according to the recommendations distributed at this meeting.

Previous Council Action

This is the 19th year that the Judicial Council will award the Distinguished Service Awards for significant and positive contributions to court administration in California.

Rationale for Recommendation

Award recipients are selected for the following qualities and achievements:

- The Ronald M. George Award for Judicial Excellence honors members of the judiciary for their extraordinary dedication to the highest principles of the administration of justice statewide.
- The William C. Vickrey Leadership in Judicial Administration Award honors individuals in judicial administration for significant statewide contributions to and leadership in their profession.
- The Bernard E. Witkin Amicus Curiae Award honors individuals other than members of the judiciary for their outstanding contributions to the courts of California.
- The Stanley Mosk Defender of Justice Award honors individuals from federal, state, and local government for significant contributions to advancing equal access to fair and consistent justice in California.
- Richard D. Huffman Justice for Children & Families Award honors individuals for significant contributions to advancing justice for children and families in California.

The Judicial Council invites nominations for five Distinguished Service Awards, presented annually by the Chief Justice to recognize individuals who exemplify the strengths of leadership that have improved the administration of justice statewide.

***R*ONALD M. GEORGE AWARD FOR JUDICIAL EXCELLENCE**, honoring members of the judiciary for their extraordinary dedication to the highest principles of the administration of justice statewide

***W*ILLIAM C. VICKREY LEADERSHIP IN JUDICIAL ADMINISTRATION AWARD**, honoring individuals in judicial administration for significant contributions to and leadership in their profession statewide

***B*ERNARD E. WITKIN AMICUS CURIAE AWARD**, honoring individuals other than members of the judiciary for outstanding contributions to the courts of California

***S*TANLEY MOSK DEFENDER OF JUSTICE AWARD**, honoring individuals from federal, state, and local government for significant contributions to advancing equal access to fair and consistent justice in California

***R*ICHARD D. HUFFMAN JUSTICE FOR CHILDREN & FAMILIES AWARD**, honoring individuals for significant contributions to advancing justice for children and families in California

*A*WARDS CRITERIA

Honorees are recognized for

- Contributions to leadership in statewide court administration, including the breadth and impact of their work and the longevity of these efforts
 - ♦ Leadership and commitment in partnering with the judicial branch to achieve positive changes in statewide court administration (for the Stanley Mosk Award only)
 - ♦ Leadership and commitment in advancing justice for children and families in California (Richard D. Huffman Award only)
- Advancement of Judicial Council goals: access, fairness, and diversity; independence and accountability; modernization of management and administration; quality of justice and service to the public; education for branchwide professional excellence; and branchwide infrastructure for service excellence
- Personal dedication and/or a willingness to take risks to achieve goals
- Overcoming challenges or limitations

Current Judicial Council members are not eligible to receive Distinguished Service Awards, except in the case of the Stanley Mosk Defender of Justice Award and the Richard D. Huffman Justice for Children & Families Award. A maximum of two awards per category may be given each year.
