Structure for Pilot

- Lead legal services agency which works with others who help with conflicts, multiple representation
- Partnership with the court which is to provide services to assist those litigants who remain unrepresented

Impact of counsel on equal access to justice

Effect on court administration & efficiency

Enhanced coordination between courts, governmental service providers, community resources

Benefits of providing representation for clients and the courts



Funding

- From designated postjudgment filing fees
 - Anticipated to be \$11 million
 - 2011 \$9.5 million
 - 2014 \$7.8 million



First cycle of grants

- 9.5 million distributed to:
- 6 housing projects
- 3 custody projects
- 1 probate guardianship/ conservatorship project



Evaluation commenced

- Common data across programs
- Site visits and interviews
- Court file review
- Client interviews
- Collection of data for cost-benefit analysis



Recommendation process

- Legislatively mandated committee
- RFP issued
- All proposals considered by the committee



Guiding principles

- Legislative priority to existing successful programs
- Maintenance of projects to allow for thorough evaluation as required by statute





1) Fund Existing Programs

2) Level of funding

- Amount legal services program received last year or amount of request (whichever is less)
- Highest amount court spent in last three years



3) Potential increases

Since no increases to address increased costs

Programs getting less than what was requested

Thus, if additional funding is received, distribute pro rata
