Need for the Plan

- Equal access to justice for all is the cornerstone of our judicial process
- 7 million Limited English Proficient
 Californians are potential court users
- Language access is critical
- Voices from the planning process reinforced this need



Public Voices

The LAP supports Goal I of the Judicial Council's 2006-2016 Strategic Plan:

- All persons will have equal access to the courts and court proceedings
- Court procedures will be fair and understandable to court users; and
- Members of the judicial branch community will strive to understand and be responsive to the needs of court users from diverse cultural backgrounds



Content of the Plan

- Set of 75 comprehensive recommendations
- Promotes language access as a core court service in every courthouse branchwide
- Accommodates individual court need for flexibility

- One time and ongoing funding



Recommendations

- Council to adopt final plan
- Immediately form Language
 Access Implementation Task Force
 (ITF), and Translation Committee
- ITF will provide periodic updates to E&P and/or council regarding LAP implementation progress
